In anticipation for my upgrade to minimum custody on August 1st, I've passed the leadership baton to another guy in my housing unit, moved into what I call my retirement home (it's a room that is much smaller and the furthest away from everyone else as is possible), and am taking myself out of prison politics completely. It is great to see that the systems that I set into place over the past three years are holding steady and are now just part of the landscape here. At least in my housing unit. Part of that is that I just got lucky and the new leader thinks very much like I do on most things. I'm happy to have improved some things over my time here, and am very much ready to move on, even if it is just to the housing unit next door to minimum custody.


This afternoon I received a letter of introduction from Mrs. Pagila, and she seems like a wonderful addition to Team UAP.

Also encouraging is the upcoming book Mr. Don Brown has written. I think he's done a superb job and it will serve as a catalyst for bringing the men of first platoon at least to a place where they can feel as if they are not criminals. It may even have the effect of giving them a certain degree of closure, or vindication. For that I am truly thankful. From this point on, if someone asks me to tell them my story, I'm just saying "read the book." That way I won't have to keep ripping the scab off.

As far as books go, I'm corresponding with Mr. Don Snyder, where he is on the ground in Scotland with the caddie project for wounded warriors. He has sent me the first twenty or so pages of the book he's writing, and I think it will be a great compliment to Mr. Brown's book. Mr. Brown does a great job of covering the legal stuff and Mr. Snyder will come in with the family and life story stuff. Great combination, I think. I'm very excited about it all, and the potential impact it will have on those who make policy in Washington as it regards to the UCMJ and the ROE.

Well, I guess that about wraps it up for me tonight. Thank you all so much for everything Ma'am. God bless you. Stay *Fired Up*, we're going to win this one, and so many more.
